Florida Association of Nurse Anesthesiology Marks "CRNA Day" at The Capitol

~Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists Express Support for HB 1067 and SB 1058~

Tallahassee, Fla. – More than 120 Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists (CRNAs) and Resident Registered Nurse Anesthetists (RRNA) from across the state will be at the Florida Capitol on **Wednesday, March 22, 2023**, to meet with legislators from their districts. The CRNAs are advocating for changes to Florida's unnecessarily restrictive anesthesia practice laws while expressing their support for two bills; <u>HB 1067</u> by Rep. Mike Giallombardo and <u>SB 1058</u> by Sen. Ana Maria Rodriguez titled "Autonomous Practice by an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse."

CRNAs will also be hosting a booth on the 2nd Floor of The Capitol that will showcase intubation techniques and ultrasound equipment used for pain blocks and promoting better outcomes for patients. Visitors will be able to get hands-on training using simulation manikins that are used to demonstrate the complexity of anesthesia training and the care CRNAs provide patients every day.

Florida is one of a handful of states that has yet to revise their CRNA practice laws to accurately reflect the role of CRNAs as full-service anesthesia providers – making it more challenging for the state to retain and recruit these highly trained, in-demand specialists. In fact, as result of these restrictions, one out of every three CRNAs who graduates in Florida leaves the state.
