## FANA Honors Its Health Care Heroes for Defending Health of Florida's Vulnerable Communities During COVID-19 Pandemic

Demonstrated Commitment to Healing Florida's People While Keeping State Moving

**Tallahassee, Fla.** -- The Florida Association of Nurse Anesthetists (FANA) today hailed its members' work over the past year to step up, serve vulnerable Floridians, and meet the historic health care challenges the COVID-19 pandemic placed on communities across the state.

FANA's CRNA members are highly trained health care professionals who provide comprehensive anesthesia care to patients before, during and after surgical and obstetrical procedures. They are the primary anesthesia professionals in rural and medically underserved areas, as well as to U.S. military personnel on the front lines, navy ships, and aircraft evacuation teams around the globe.

"I'm proud of the immediate, unselfish, patient-first response of FANA's members to Gov. Ron DeSantis clarion call to action when the pandemic hit. FANA's members made an incredible difference as part of Team Florida's work to keep the state moving when the world came to a standstill," said FANA President John McDonough, EdD, CRNA. "When the pandemic hit, there was no way to lock down FANA's health care heroes urgent, driving commitment to serve our state's most vulnerable people. Our members immediately stepped up and went from supporting fellow healthcare providers in overtasked hospitals in the early days of the pandemic to injecting life-saving vaccination shots into the arms of Floridians."

Saying, "No job was too small or large," Dr. McDonough noted how FANA members immediately jumped into action to coordinate a volunteer effort across the state to help county health departments with vaccinations following Gov. DeSantis' March 2020 declaration of a COVID-19 state of emergency. FANA volunteers, along with other fellow nursing professionals worked hundreds of hours at the vaccination sites helping with injections, data entry, traffic control, and patient monitoring.

The Florida Division of Emergency Management recently recognized FANA for its work to recruit volunteer nurses to staff vaccine-injection sites across Florida. According to DEM, more than 3,300 APRNS, including FANA CRNAs, SRNAs and RNs volunteered to immunize people at key sites.
